## **Second Year Program News**

It's been said that the end of the school year is bittersweet – we will be saying goodbye to what we've known and learned all year and saying hello to what's to come in the school year ahead. Endings of one thing involve beginnings to another and children and adults alike respond differently to each. Therefore, all second year classes will be involved in conversations and discussions about children's feelings, singing songs we've sung together throughout the year, and perhaps reading once again stories read and revisiting favorite activities.

It often helps when discussing transitions with your child to talk about what's to come so children know what to expect, but in a way they can understand and with a certain amount of information needed along the way. To explain about the coming months of summer and that a new school experience will start in the fall helps children to understand that this experience, whether seen as an adventure, an opportunity, or met with some hesitation, will be explored after the summer time. Later in the summer would be a more appropriate time to discuss detailed information about the fall. This allows your child, and your family, to enjoy being in the moment.

During this month of May, all classes will be exploring the outdoors more frequently. We will enjoy planting seeds and observing the transition from seed to flower or grass. We will also learn about the transition from caterpillar to butterfly as we observe this metamorphosis among the caterpillars in our classrooms. There is a story that tells of a boy who, watching a butterfly — as it appears to him, "struggle" out of its cocoon- decides to help it by opening the cocoon himself. The butterfly was then unable to fly because it did not have the right amount of time in the cocoon to strengthen its

wings. The same is true for children. Let's let them be in the moment, for when it is the right time they will then fly onto their new adventure.

On Wednesday, May 18 the 4 & 5 Day children and their teachers will take a Bus Trip to the Chandler Elementary School in Duxbury. The 5 Day morning class bus will leave at 9:30. Parents may drop the children off in their classroom at the regular 9:00 start time, and are welcome to wait in the multi-purpose room or outside until 9:30. The 4 Day students will start their trip at 12:30 so parents must arrive at Berrybrook at 12:15 on that day.

Although many Berrybrook students will be attending kindergarten in other towns in our community we feel the trip to Chandler School is fun and very appropriate. The goal of this visit is to help children anticipate kindergarten positively by providing them a glimpse of a kindergarten setting. Permission slips will be available soon

# Wonderful New School

# Education Extended Now To Four and Five-Yr.-Olds

DUXBURY-Thirty-two South Shore children will enter Duxbury's Berrybrook School next month with one hand clutching mommy and the other a blanket.

So begins an "exciting adventure in adocation" for the four and five-year-olds venturing into the-strange and wapderful world of waysery school and kinder-

Berrytrook is an endowed, non profit school operated by Mrs Riokard D. Mann and directed by Miss Bejen M. Wheeler, both of Dunbury.

Both are graduates of what ence was known as the Nursery Trugging School of Boston and now is the Eliot-Pearson School, a Tuess University affiliate.

#### 'Can Be Brutal'

Migs Wheeler is also a former public school teacher and director of Boston's South End Day Nurseau

Both will readily admit that schooling before the first grade or that lack of kindergarten experience need be a major handicap in the years of formal education.

"Bui," Miss Wheeler added quickly, "the evidence is that nursery and kindergarien training do help, not only in the first grade, but all the way through."

"For the child leaving the shelter of home for the first time, first grade can be a brutal experience." One reason is the "appailing schedules of many first grade teachers."

The Berrytrook teachers are aware that nursery school can be a brutal experience and take every precaution to insure that the child has no unhappy associations during the first crucial date.

#### Mothers Go. Too

A mother is expected to remain with her child until the youngster himself indicates he no longer needs her loving presence. Some get waved off almost atthe door. Occasionally a mother will attend echool for a week to two before the youngster emerges from his occoon and enters into group activities.

One of the "great thrills" of Miss Wheeler's previous teaching career came house a fiveyear-old who one day suddenly took over the leadership of his playmates after standing quiety on the sidelines for a year and

to the day's program at Berrybrook, periods of reruging activity alternating with periods of calmness—moluting a rest time with the precious blacket from home. But there are no "subjects" to be transfer.

.If a child happens to learn the important and difficult skill of tying shoelaces, all to the good. But such an achievement is a mere side product.

#### Group Feeling

One of the biggest problems facing the youngeter is in learning that the achool's toys don't belong to him but to the group, the teacher said. Often a youngsterwill sneak one of the toys home.

"But to crack down on him for such a little thing could may the child mortality." Mrs. Mann said. The school asks only that he return the toy and request permission the next time.

By the age of four, children need the company of other chiltren the same age, Miss Wheeler

"The biggest thing they learn here is how to get along, not only with other youngsters, but with soults other than their parents.
