Notes from the Head of School

Anyone else struggling with the time of year? Almost daily I am reassuring myself that it is the first month of our school year. It could be that I feel like I 'lost' the majority of the summer due to some commitments, or that there are Christmas items presently stocked on store shelves, or that the leaves were turning colors already, with one of our favorite trees at Berrybrook already bare of those pretty leaves from a particular windy weekend. The tree was just leafless before the calendar even told us it was the first day of autumn. It's no wonder we're a bit confused.

One other way I know it's the fall is the Berrybrook Harvest Festival, and since this year we are switching it back to the Spring Fling in May, it is also intruding with my seasonality. I'm sure that many, especially those who have enjoyed our Fests in the past, may feel a sense of disappointment. It was only after much discussion and reflection that we made this decision. The planning for the Harvest Festival begins months in advance and the summer is such a busy time for all, proving difficult to organize with so many of our planners going in many directions during that important time. However the biggest factor was that for some of our students, typically those who attend two days a week, are still settling into their routines with new faces in their new spaces. When they arrive for the Fest, those comforts they were starting to feel can sometimes be completely thrown off with the addition of a hundred or so more people, raffles baskets, face painting, music on the playground, and more. We tended to see a bit of a regression in some of the students post-Festival, and on the other spectrum we have some students who were disappointed there weren't hayrides during their class outdoor time when the came back on Monday! By May everyone will be more confident in their routines and have a true sense of ownership of Berrybrook being their school.

Traditions are a core of Berrybrook, and although the Fest will now be a Fling we will still celebrate our school in the most developmentally appropriate way, which again is another core of Berrybrook - finding the best and most appropriate way at our child-centered school. Enjoy this year, and all the traditions ahead!

Led by teachers who radiate compassion and kindness, Berrybrook classrooms become caring communities where my children first felt at home away from home. When Mrs. LaForest writes down a child's own words, or passes a "talking feather" to give each child uninterrupted time to speak, she recognizes the work and wonder of being a preschooler. And as my children felt seen and heard at school, they began to belong and thrive.


