Notes from the Head of School

Each spring, we kick off our Annual Appeal for the Wheeler Scholarship Fund, which you may have heard during your time at Berrybrook. If you had a tour, we mention to all families that we have a Scholarship Fund. Often, the first comment is "Oh, I don't think we'd qualify". So what exactly IS the scholarship fund?

What is it?

The Helen Wheeler Scholarship Fund is the primary source of tuition assistance to Berrybrook families. All money raised through the Annual Appeal is earmarked for the Wheeler Fund. The primary purpose of this fund is to provide tuition assistance to parents and/or guardians of children who have been accepted to Berrybrook, and who would not be able to attend without financial assistance.

Who qualifies?

The Wheeler Scholarship Fund was created by Mrs. Katharine Mann, our school's founder. She created the fund so that finances never prevented a child from attending Berrybrook. All assistance is based on demonstrated financial need, the number of families applying for assistance that year, and the amount of funding available.

Does it need to be paid back?

The assistance is a scholarship, not a loan. Many recipients will make donations to the Fund years later when their financial picture is a bit stronger as a way to pay it forward to other families.

Will the teachers or anyone else know who receives help?

The process is a confidential one. Families complete an online application, and are required to submit supporting documentation such as W2s and prior tax year reports. The Board of Directors receives a report of how much aid has been awarded and the number of children benefiting from the Fund. No names are attached to these reports.

Who is Helen Wheeler?

Helen M. Wheeler was the first director of Berrybrook, when Berrybrook first opened its doors over seventy years ago in September 1954. Mrs. Mann and Miss Wheeler were both

graduates of what was was known as the Nursery Training School of Boston, which is now the Eliot-Pearson School, a TuftsUniversity affiliate.

How is it funded?

All money raised from the Annual Appeal or similar fundraisers (minus fees much as PayPal processing fees) goes to scholarships.

How can I receive more information?

I would be happy to speak with anyone who is interested in applying for the Wheeler Scholarship Fund!

How can I make a donation?

Berrybrook is a non-profit organization, which means any donation made is tax deductible. Teacher's Notes

Is my child ready for kindergarten? This question lingers around the Berrybrook halls every year around this time. The weather is getting warmer, kindergarten conversations are happening over the dinner table, children are talking about it at school. Some children are excited and/or nervous to 'go to kindergarten'. That excited or nervous feeling can present in many different ways: anxiety, acting out, asking if kindergarten 'starts very soon/next week,' the whole idea can be overwhelming to a young child. You, as the parent may also be nervous, excited and anxious. Give a gentle reminder to yourself that while you are capable of regulating your emotions (mostly), children are unable to regulate their emotions without the help of the adult(s) in their lives, especially during times of change and transition. While you might be excited to share all of the 'big' things ahead, try and remember that your child doesn't understand in the same way that you do.

At Berrybrook we teach the whole child. Physically, emotionally, academically, mentally; there are many factors that go into whether your child is ready. As teachers, we are teaching, watching and observing your child from the very first day of school each year. We take into consideration the foundations of learning at this level. In the 4 & 5 Day program, we see if the children show some self-direction at the beginning of the year. Do they like to participate in activities? Do they show empathy? Can they begin to recognize shapes, the letters in their names? We listen and talk to the children; we watch them listen and talk to each other. Each child learns and grows at their own pace, what works for one child may not work for another and more importantly, one way of learning is not better than another. We have conversations, so many conversations with parents, and more if they're needed. Have confidence that the teachers are preparing your child for what is next, whether that's another year of preschool or moving onto kindergarten.

Seven years ago, I found myself thinking about whether or not my child was ready for kindergarten. While my first child was at Berrybrook, I was a nervous wreck. Though I thought my son was brilliant, adorable, (all the adjectives), I kept wondering in the back of my mind if he was ready. Was he confident enough? Was he mature enough? Could he handle the long days? I brought up my worries/anxiety during my fall conference when he was in the 4-day classroom, and yes, I asked for an extra conference in January to discuss this topic further! Berrybrook's teachers are understanding, accommodating, and just as they give the children room to grow into themselves, they also give the parents the same room to grow and learn. When I met with Mrs. LaForest to talk about my son, she let me 'vent,' all my worries and frustrations, she listened, she helped, and in the end she said that my son was 100% ready for his next step (and she also reassured me that I was also ready).

Is my child ready for kindergarten? Is my child ready to walk? Run? Is my child ready for middle school? A relationship? College? What I've learned over the years, especially after becoming a parent, is to stick with your instincts, they're usually right. BUT, when you are questioning those instincts, the biggest lesson I've learned is to always ask for help or advice (whether it's teachers, other parents, friends), in all stages of life. It takes a village.

All my children hold their memories close and look back at their time at Berrybrook with wide smiles. It truly is a special place.
